CALL FOR ENTRIES

This Call for Entries contains all relevant information for the Daytime Emmy Awards. The [National Emmys General Rules & Procedures](#) outlines all procedures applying uniformly to all national NATAS Emmys contests (Daytime, News & Documentary, Sports).

WHAT ARE THE DAYTIME EMMY AWARDS?

The Daytime Emmy Awards recognize outstanding achievement in Daytime entertainment programming broadcast or made available between the hours of **2:00am and 6:00pm**, or exclusively VOD and digital content that identifies as Daytime entertainment programming by virtue of genre, by conferring annual awards of merit in various categories. The presentation of these awards is intended to be an incentive for the continued pursuit of excellence.

HOW DO THE DAYTIME EMMY AWARDS WORK?

This year's contest is launched as of January 6, 2021, with the submission site to open soon thereafter. Following approval by the National Awards Committee, the new contest rules and procedures, and a by-category submission guide for 2020-2021 are available online directly on the submission site at daytimeemmys.dmds.com.

A Call for Entries and notification of registration for potential judges is sent to a wide cross section of the daytime television community. Entries and judges are solicited from shows, networks, syndicators, independent producers and crafts persons.

HOW ARE THE DAYTIME EMMYS DIFFERENT FROM THE PRIMETIME EMMYS?

The Primetime Emmys, honoring the best in Primetime entertainment viewing, are administered by our sister Academy, the Television Academy. The Daytime Emmys are administered by the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences. The Daytime Emmys have been awarded since 1974.

The Primetime and Daytime statues are IDENTICAL. They are produced at the same manufacturer to the same specifications.

In keeping with the NATAS tradition also employed by the Sports Emmys, News & Documentary Emmys, and Regional Emmys, the Daytime Emmys use a peer judging process (see Judging section). At the outset of the contest, all submissions are accompanied by viewing/evaluation materials such as video and accompanying essays. Judges evaluate entries in their field of expertise and grade all entries in a given category.

For returning entrants, below is a list of changes to the contest for 2020-2021.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- If you have questions about content disrupted by the pandemic, please reach out to Daytime Administration. It is the goal of the contest to make every possible allowance within the parameters of these rules.
- NATAS has committed to all ceremonies for the 2021 calendar year being completely virtual, regardless of any updates to public health that could potentially change by mid-2021.
- For this cycle only, the Daytime Emmys are accepting re-entries from 2019 entrants in the categories of Interactive Media for a Daytime Program and Individual Achievement in Animation as Administration was unable to properly adjudicate these categories in compliance with social distancing requirements. Eligible entrants who demonstrated they either made the Blue Ribbon Judging round and/or were unable to provide digital materials once in-person judging was canceled were contacted prior to the publication of these rules and submitted written intent to re-enter. The material for Interactive can be updated to reflect changes since the original entry.
- If your content is projected to be 3 episodes or more, but less than 3 episodes were able to be shot and/or broadcast/streamed due to COVID-related shutdowns (5 episodes for the Limited Drama Series category), all episodes will be eligible to enter next year's 2021-2022 contest. Next year there will be a one-year holdover for content unable to be completed and episodes aired in 2020 will be eligible if part of a season where the majority of content aired/was streamed in 2021.

RIGHTS AND CLEARANCES

- Entrants will be required to identify a thirty-second (0:30) portion of the submitted video for potential inclusion in a Daytime Emmys ceremony, should the entry result in a nomination. The identified clip must be free and clear of any and all encumbrances which could limit the ability of NATAS to include the clip in the program and its distribution, publicity, and promotion, including without limitation digital program archives, in perpetuity. Entrants must affirm that all necessary rights and clearances have been obtained and are thereby licensed to NATAS for these purposes, and that the entrant is authorized to convey such rights.

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING

- In agreement with the LA Television Academy/Primetime Emmys, ALL Children's Programming should come to the Daytime Emmys, regardless of daypart. The Primetime Emmys has eliminated their Outstanding Children's Program category. If you have previously entered your children's content in Primetime, your program is automatically eligible to enter all Children's Programming categories at the Daytime Emmys. Primetime is retaining an Animated Program category for adult-oriented animated content only (e.g. "The Simpsons," "South Park," etc.)

TRACKS

In order to streamline the competition and make it clearer to entrants which ancillary categories content is eligible to enter, Daytime has split the competition into the following Genres, listed below with the Program categories found within:

DRAMA

FICTION

Limited Drama; Short Form Daytime Fiction; Young Adult; Daytime Fiction Special

NON-FICTION

Culinary; Game Show; Legal/Courtroom; Lifestyle; Informational and How-To; Arts and Popular Culture; Travel, Adventure and Nature; Morning Show; Entertainment Talk Show; Informational Talk Show; Entertainment News; Entertainment Program in Spanish; Special Event Program; Daytime Non-Fiction Special

CHILDREN'S

Preschool Children's; Children's and Family Viewing; Preschool Animation; Animation; Special Class Daytime Animated; Short Form Children's

Also:

- Digital Drama has been renamed Limited Drama Series. Standards for eligibility remain the same except the maximum number of episodes has been lowered from 35 to 22.
- If your content would be programmed to air at 10pm or later if on traditional television, it must be entered into the Primetime Emmys and is not eligible for the Daytime Emmys. This includes content that contains graphic violence, nudity, sex, and/or excessive coarse language.

Also: (Continuation)

- **Dramas** retain their own separate track with their own acting, writing, and directing categories. The following genres are merged to a single **Fiction Daytime Program** genre track: **Limited Drama Series** (formerly Digital; 22 episodes or less per year), **Short Form Fiction Program** (for content 15 minutes or less), **Young Adult Series**, and **Daytime Fiction Special**. Entrants in these categories are eligible for specialized acting, writing, and directing categories. Performers in children's entertainment (including Educational/Informational) are eligible for the renamed Principal and Limited Performance in a Children's Daytime Program categories. Young Adult programming is no longer eligible in the Children's track.
- All formerly Drama-only craft categories are now open to Drama and Fiction Daytime Programs.
- If your content would be programmed to air at 10pm or later if on traditional television, it must be entered into the Primetime Emmys and is not eligible for the Daytime Emmys. This includes content that contains graphic violence, nudity, sex, and/or excessive coarse language.

NEW CATEGORIES

Short Form Fiction Program – for narrative dramatic fiction Series or Specials with an average runtime of less than 15 minutes.

Daytime Fiction Special – one-off specials of 15 minutes or longer of Daytime shows, standalone TV movies for a daytime audience, Young Adult specials, fictional “afterschool specials” designed for a YA audience.

Informational and How-To Program – Daytime programming with a focus on DIY, home improvement, technology building, repair, crafting. How-to for audiences under the age of 17 belongs in Educational/Informational Program.

Arts and Popular Culture Program – Daytime programming with a focus on entertainment, celebrities, Hollywood, theatre, red carpet, etc., exclusive of Entertainment News programming (e.g. “Entertainment Tonight”).

Daytime Special Event – non-fiction Daytime programming such as parades, awards shows, dog shows, etc. that qualify as one-time events.

Daytime Non-Fiction Special – social, political, economic documentaries, stand-alone Specials or non-fiction “afterschool specials” with a focus on audiences under the age of 17. Content for older audiences should be entered into the News & Documentary Emmys.

Younger Performer in a Daytime Fiction Program – non-gendered acting category for performers ages 18 and under with a lead, supporting or guest performance on a Daytime Fiction Program. Series and Specials both qualify. Performers can turn 18 in the calendar year 2020 and qualify.

Younger Performer in a Children’s Program – non-gendered acting category for performers age 18 and under with a lead, supporting or guest performance on a live-action Children’s or Preschool Children’s Program. Series and Special both qualify. Performers can turn 18 in the calendar year 2020 and qualify.

Voice Directing for an Animated Series – directing for animation or the animated portions of Preschool or Children’s Animated content.

Editing for a Preschool Animated Program – editing for Preschool Animated content is now this separate category. Editing for an Animated Program is now specific to animated programming for viewers over the age of 5.

Casting for a Children’s Program – for casting directors who work on live-action Preschool or Children’s and Family Viewing content. Casting for animated content entries are eligible in the Casting for an Animated Program category.

NEW CATEGORIES

Young Adult Series – this category is now for Series (5 episodes or more) only. Young Adult Specials are qualified in the newly created **Daytime Fiction Special** category.



Game Show – the number of episodes to be considered eligible for this category has been lowered to 3.



Directing for a Game Show – this has been eliminated as a separate category. Directors for a Game Show are now Emmy-eligible in the Multiple Camera Directing category.

NEW CATEGORIES (CONTINUED)

Directing for a Talk or Morning Show – this has been eliminated as a separate category. Directors for Talk or Morning programming are eligible in the Multiple Camera Directing category.

Special Class Series – this has been eliminated as a separate category. Administration welcomes former Special Class Series entrants to enter in one of the newly available more streamlined categories, including (but not limited to) **Arts and Popular Culture Program** and **Informational and How-To Program**.

Special Class Special – this category has been eliminated as a separate category. Administration welcomes former Special Class Special entrants to enter in one of the newly available more streamlined categories, including (but not limited to) **Daytime Fiction Special** and **Daytime Non-Fiction Special**.

Morning Show in Spanish – this category has been eliminated as a separate category. Administration welcomes former Morning Show in Spanish entrants into the **Daytime Program in a Spanish Language category**. Anchors, Hosts and Correspondents from Morning Shows are now eligible in the **Talent** category.

Preschool Children's Series – this category has been eliminated as a separate category. Administration welcomes former Preschool Children's Series entrants into the **Children's or Family Viewing Program** category, which is now open to programming designed for viewers under the age of 5.

Sound Mixing and **Sound Editing** – for **Live-Action, Children's,** and **Preschool Children's** programming, the Sound Mixing and Sound Editing categories have been combined.

Daytime Promotional Announcement – formerly two categories (one for Brand Image Campaign and one for Topical), all promos are now eligible in the singular Daytime Promotional Announcement category. Content must be promoting Daytime programming or campaign and point to a daypart tune-in to be eligible, regardless of when the promo itself airs. Entrants can submit a composite reel of up to three spots. Spots for unrelated events or PSAs, e.g. breast cancer awareness month, are no longer eligible.

NEW CATEGORIES (CONTINUED)

Younger Performer in a Drama Series – in defining Young Adult content and Younger Performer categories in other genres, the Daytime Emmys will be gradually changing the parameters for entry into this category. The current eligibility is for performers on a Drama Series who are under the age of 25. This will be the final year in which age 25 is the cut-off. Next year it will be lowered to 21 and for 2023, it will be lowered again to 18. Additionally, Younger Performer entrants are permitted to enter this category an infinite number of times while they are under 18, but once they turn 18, they are permitted to enter only three times before being moved to either Lead or Supporting. Being age-qualified to enter Younger does NOT mean an entrant is required to. Lead and Supporting acting categories are also open to performers under the age of 25.

Individual Achievement in Animation – this category is now judged completely online. All assets previously submitted in a hard-copy format (eg. artwork) will now be uploaded. See the By-Category Submission guide for specifics.

Drama/Daytime Fiction Acting Categories – there will be no Pre-Nomination Round. All entrants should submit their video by the deadline, where categories will undergo Preliminary and/or Blue Ribbon Judging in accordance with all other categories. There is no second video submission.

Drama Crafts – last year Daytime Administration began the process of merging craft areas where Drama contenders did not have enough entrants to keep the categories viable. This year the remaining craft categories have been combined to allow entrants from Dramas and Daytime Fiction Programs. The following crafts have now been merged: Costumes, Makeup, Hairstyling, Sound Mixing and Editing (now combined, as per above), and Technical Team. Music Direction and Composition, which was merged last year, is now further merged to include all Drama, Fiction, and Non-Fiction eligible content (e.g. only Children's and Animation is disallowed in this category).

Children's and Animation Program Categories – the title of Associate Producer, while not on list, may petition to be eligible in these program categories. Petitions to Administration must include job descriptions and the National Awards Committee will decide eligibility based on appropriate job function.

Hosting Categories – all Hosting categories are now reel categories (e.g. you will now be able to submit a reel containing content from more than one episode).

FEES

- Given circumstances, there will be a pause on Entry Fee increases for this year. All rates remain identical to last year's. In addition, without live ceremonies, there is no cost for tickets this year. We trust you will take full advantage to further your productions, or perhaps consider entering additional categories. Please be advised that annual incremental increases will be reinstated next year.

YANGAROO

- There is now only one sign-up that is good for both entering and judging. Only the user has access to password information.
- Streaming content will now have the opportunity to identify entries as such during sign-up and therefore will no longer be prompted to enter an airtime. Broadcast content is still required to enter an airtime.
- Early Entry now requires ALL materials, including videos, to be uploaded prior to the deadline. There is no more "Upload Later" option.

GENERAL

SUBMISSION INFORMATION:

- In addition to the required entry contact, all submissions now have an optional second contact field. **We HIGHLY ENCOURAGE all awards consultancies to use this field and put direct client contact information.** Administration will reach out to all entry contacts on record regarding purchasing ceremony tickets in the event of a nomination. Entry contacts are the **ONLY** way Administration has to contact entrants for required follow-up information. **It is the full responsibility of the entrant, including awards consultancies, to make sure that all contact information is correct and valid.**

WEBINARS:

- Administration will be once again running pre-scheduled webinars during the submission process. Webinar dates are weekly on **Tuesdays at 3pm ET/noon PT** through the entirety of the entry window. Webinars are **FREE**, **NOT** mandatory, and you do not need to RSVP.

- Please note that daytime@theemmys.tv is the contact for Daytime Administration. They can answer questions about eligibility, entry requirements, deadlines, etc. Email is the best way to receive an expedited response as Administration is working remotely. It should be your first method of outreach, with prescheduled phone or Zoom to follow.

CALL FOR ENTRIES

The Call for Entries opens on **January 6, 2021**. The Daytime online system at daytimeemmys.dmds.com, powered by Yangaroo, is activated and individuals may sign in and create an Emmy profile. During the entry period, entrants may log in anytime to view the status of their entries, add, correct, update or finalize entry data and pay for entries. To encourage prompt completion of entries there will be an early entry deadline of **January 27, 2021** at a reduced fee for information and payment. All entry data and video upload must be completed by or before the final deadline of **February 17, 2021**.

Returning Entrants must register anew. This is necessary in order for the Daytime system to maintain accurate and current entrant information as entrants are often involved in both the submission and judging process.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The Early Entry deadline assists Administration with establishing which categories may need to undergo two rounds of judging due to entry count.

ENTRY SUBMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

All entrants must submit content for each category they enter for evaluation by judges. This evaluation determines both the nominees and recipients in a single viewing round (with the exception of any necessary preliminary judging as noted below). Due to the variation of submission requirements in each category, please refer to the By-Category Submissions Guide section of this document which provides complete detail and deadline information for each category.

WHAT CONTENT CAN ENTER?

Broadcast: Series and Specials (depending on the category), and their related craft achievements, must have originally aired or been made generally available for viewing, by at least 50% of the US Television households between the dates of **January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020** and between the hours of **2:00am and 6:00pm**. For programs not previously submitted in the Daytime Awards, you may be asked to submit coverage data demonstrating the 50% availability in the US. A coverage document can be uploaded directly to the Yangaroo entry form. A regional program that later receives national distribution may compete in the Daytime contest, but not in the same eligibility year. A Broadcast Series considered eligible for Daytime (destined for, promoted as and predominantly airing in the Daytime hours) may submit any episode in to the Daytime Emmy Awards contest whether that episode premiered in Primetime or Daytime hours. An episode or Special from a Series premiering in Primetime hours may not enter the Primetime Emmy Awards.

Digital: Daytime content made available via an online platform fitting any of the various category and genre descriptions contained in the Daytime Emmy Awards contest are eligible, but are subject to review and final Emmy Awards contest placement approval.

WHAT CONTENT CAN ENTER? (CONTINUATION)

Animation Programs of either a fully animated or a combined animation and live-action program must be at least 65% new animation to qualify in an animated program category.

All categories allow content from all platforms.

AIR TIME EXCEPTIONS

Game Shows which air or are made available for viewing nationally between **2:00am and 8:00pm** compete in the Daytime Emmy Awards contest. Game Shows initially broadcast in the standard definition of Primetime (8:00pm – 11:00pm Eastern / 7:00pm – 10:00pm Central), must enter the Primetime Emmy Awards contest. Game shows initially transmitted at 8:00pm ET on a single feed network, (e.g. via the internet or some cable platforms that reach less than half of the country at 8:00pm ET and more than half the country prior to 8:00pm ET (7:00pm CT + 6:00pm MT + 5:00pm PT)), qualify as national programs in the Daytime rather than the Primetime competition.

Entertainment News Programs which air nationally between **2:00am and 8:00pm** may compete in the Daytime Emmy Awards contest. They may also choose to enter the Primetime Emmy Awards contest in the category of Outstanding Informational Series or Special. However, they may only choose one contest and the choice is “locked-in” for future years.

Children’s Programs are daypart exempt. As of 2020-2021, the Primetime Emmys has eliminated their Children’s Program category and all Live-Action Children’s Programming is automatically eligible for Daytime.

SPECIAL VERSUS SERIES

A Special is defined as a single original program, which is not part of a Series, and is broadcast in one or two parts. **A Series** is defined as a program comprising three or more parts or episodes. For the **Drama Series** category, a minimum number of 23 original episodes must have aired during the calendar year. For the **Limited Drama** category, a minimum number of 5 episodes and a maximum number of 22 episodes must have streamed during the calendar year. For **Game Show** a minimum number of 8 original episodes must have aired during the calendar year.

Some categories accept a Series only. Refer to the By-Category Submission section of this document to determine which categories allow Series and/or Specials. A “special” episode of a Daytime series may be entered separately as a stand-alone special, but only if it was not part of the regular series, or it involved significant and substantive format changes such as a different program running time or

different producers, writers and cast, or the content was designed with a beginning, middle and end rather than open-ended serial-style. A Broadcast Special that is part of Series considered eligible for Daytime must submit the Special to Daytime even if it premiered in Primetime hours.

NOTE: If a Special runs longer than an hour, please contact Daytime Administration for advice on how to submit the content for Program, Writing and Directing categories.

GENDERED ACTING CATEGORIES

Performers eligible in gendered acting categories are encouraged to enter the one that best fits their gender identity. The Daytime Emmys will honor the category all eligible performers select to best represent themselves.

CONTENT EXCEPTIONS

If your content would be programmed to air at 10pm or later if on traditional television, it must be entered into the Primetime Emmys and is not eligible for the Daytime Emmys. This includes content that contains graphic violence, nudity, sex, and/or excessive coarse language.

- A program may be submitted in one Program category only; however that program may be entered in as many related Performer and Craft categories as are appropriate.
- In most Program and Craft categories, only one entry per program is allowed, with the exception of Performers, Songs, Promos, and Individual Achievement in Animation categories (see detail specific to this category).
- Host, Performer and Craft categories can be submitted independently, whether the associated program has been submitted or not, but follows the eligibility of the Program.
- Multiple performers from a particular program should enter individually, however Hosts or Co-Hosts must be entered collectively as a single entry. In the case of single character being played by more than one person, all performers would be included on a single entry.
- Individuals who work in different craft disciplines on a program may enter in each of the appropriate categories associated with that discipline.
- Individuals who work on different programs may enter their work for each program as separate entries in the same category.

When a program has the choice of category placement, the producer has the discretion to enter the program and its individual achievements in the most appropriate category where it is eligible. Placement in that particular category locks in the subsequent years' placements and cannot change from year to year without review and approval of the National Awards Committee. The placement of a program automatically directs the placement of all related performer and craft achievements.

If you are unsure which associated categories you can enter, refer to the Associated Categories grid, found here in **Appendix E**.

WHAT NEEDS TO BE INCLUDED ON AN ENTRY FORM?

- **Essential Entry Information**

The following information is considered Essential Entry Information. It is REQUIRED for EACH ENTRY:

- Entrant Contact
- Category
- Program Name
- Network Name
- Total Number of Episodes for a Series (For a Special enter "1")
- Eligibility Checkboxes
- Air Time (if broadcast) – requirement waived for streamed programming
- Submission Running Time
- Submission Video
- Photograph
- Ceremony Clip
- Episode References
- Eligible Credits
- Payment

WHAT NEEDS TO BE INCLUDED ON AN ENTRY FORM? (CONTINUATION)

- **Entrant Contact**
NEW/IMPORTANT: Entrants now have the option to submit a Secondary Contact. This is strongly recommended for all constituencies entering the contest on behalf of a third party, especially awards consultancies. This contact should be directly from the show or production company, and they will also be added to contact lists for questions and required follow up.
- **Submission Video Upload**
Every single submission requires a video upload except for Interactive Media for a Daytime Program. Refer to the By-Category listing for specific requirements, such as full episode, clip reel or multiple videos.

Video is uploaded directly to the Yangaroo system at daytimeemmys.dmds.com. Click here for information on media specs.

Some categories require composite/reel videos and some categories require full episodes. DO NOT include bars and tones, DELETE commercials and other interstitials and pull blacks down to 2-3 seconds. For composite reels, we allow for clips from any episodes within the calendar year. You will be asked to list the airdates of ALL episodes using in your reel. Composite reels must NOT be sizzle reels.

The same video file can be uploaded across categories provided they have the same video requirements. Where the same video file is used for multiple categories, the file is uploaded once and assigned to the appropriate categories. Once the submitted video has been encoded for the judging platform, a confirmation email is sent to the entrant, and the entrant MUST conduct a final review for judging-readiness. You may also choose to upload separate videos for each category, depending on the video requirements and what aspects you want your submission to showcase.

It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure that all videos uploaded are correctly formatted.

If you are entering audio categories on behalf of a program, it is now required that a supervising mixer and/or editor from the team review and approve the audio of your submission file BEFORE uploading to the Yangaroo system and AFTER the video has been encoded, to ensure that it presents the best quality for the judges. This approval will be indicated with a checkbox. Specs for all videos can be found here.

- **Photograph Upload**

For **Program** and **Craft** categories - you must upload a hi-res photo of your show logo. For **Performer (Acting and Host)** categories - you must upload a hi-res photo of your talent. Administration reserves the right to use these photos for production and the website.

- **Ceremony Clip**

NEW/IMPORTANT: Entrants must fill in the Time Into Video section in the Entry. This designates the start time of the 30 seconds you wish to be used as your clip should the Entry receive a nomination. The identified clip must be free and clear of any and all encumbrances which could limit the ability of NATAS to include the clip in the program and its distribution, publicity, and promotion, including without limitation digital program archives, in perpetuity. Entrants must affirm that all necessary rights and clearances have been obtained and are thereby licensed to NATAS for these purposes, and that the entrant is authorized to convey such rights.

- **Episode References**

Each entry requires a listing of ALL airdates and episode numbers included in your submission video. This is for Administration to properly vet the eligibility of your submission. For further details on Episode References, click here to see **Appendix C**.

- **Eligible Credit List**

Please be sure to enter Emmy eligible team members in the order you wish them to be displayed. Credit lists will NOT be alphabetized by Administration. These spellings and titles as submitted will appear on press releases, invitations, print programs, archives, and the statue (if you win). You can change the order of listed names by using the arrows.

Credit lists submissions in ALL CAPS will no longer be accepted. Entrants will be required to resubmit.

- **Eligible Credit List (continuation)**

By **a week before nominations**, you should have done a final review, based on the Producer Proof, of all credits and verified that they appear as listed. After **the ceremony for your category takes place**, a fee of **\$150** will be charged for each name added to the credits. This fee also applies to any changes made following the ceremonies. **Changes received more than 30 days after the ceremony will not be accepted regardless of circumstances.**

- **Eligibility Based on Percentages**

For team awards for a Series, where a person may be eligible to be listed only if they have worked a certain percentage of the total number of episodes airing in the 2020 calendar year. The total number of episodes should be recorded early in the submission form. As you add team members you will need to record the number of episodes an individual worked. The system calculates greater than 19% or 40% (depending on the category) and allows that person to be added. In certain instances an individual may be eligible and under contract for the season or the year, and that will override percentage rules.

- **Emmy Essay**

It is recommended (but not required) that entrants include an Emmy essay or précis up to 200 words explaining why they believe the program or achievement to be Emmy-worthy. This is an opportunity to include information regarding the entry that may not be evident in solely viewing the visual submission, such as a technical descriptions or how program, performances or crafts challenges were met during the season. This essay will be seen by the judges. For further details on what to include in the Emmy Essay, click here to see **Appendix A**.

- **Interactive Media Category URL Submission Guidelines and Judging**

For entries in the Interactive Media for a Daytime Program category, URL links must lead directly to your Emmy submission and should remain operational for the duration of judging. If the standard link is no longer fully live at entry or judging time, please create a sandbox “demo” environment or a link to an explanatory video or presentation to demonstrate how the content functioned when it was taking place. Submissions in this category will be judged in 2 rounds, and finalists will be evaluated in the Blue Ribbon Round by a live-panel of experts. If necessary, entrants may present submissions to the panel in person, provide specialized equipment for judges to experience submissions as originally intended, and answer questions from the panel. Digital content reflecting primetime programming should enter the Primetime Emmy Awards.

- **Individual Achievement in Animation**

This category honors the work of an INDIVIDUAL in a variety of animation disciplines such as Production Design/Art Direction, Storyboard, Character Design and Animation, Background Design and Color, and is Juried Award, judged by a panel of animation experts. A program or network may enter multiple separate entries for individuals who work on the show. An individual may submit themselves if the program or network decides not to.

SUBMISSION VIDEO

Please note that the file you upload is the same file that will stream to judges. In this manner, you can be certain that the file you provide will be the same quality as seen by the judges. SIGNING UP

Opening on February 1, 2021: Individuals can register to participate as a judge, at daytimeemmys.dmds.com and create a judging profile. The deadline for judges to register is **March 23, 2021**. Before judging commences, approved judges are sent individualized login information to access and evaluate submissions and cast ballots online.

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Judges are required to disclose all programming they are currently working on or have worked on within the past two (2) years. Judges are not permitted to judge categories featuring their own work. If a judge is placed on a panel in which they have a conflict of interest, the onus is on the judge to alert Administration.

JUDGING QUALIFICATIONS FOR DAYTIME

Judges must be a member of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, the Television Academy, other qualified organizations, be a previous Primetime or Daytime Emmy nominee, and/or have at least two years of experience within the respective field within the past five years. Judges are individually vetted for qualifications, areas of expertise, and conflicts of interest. For a list of other qualified organizations, please visit [here](#).

Eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis. Approval and panel assignment is made based upon information provided on the Judge's Application or from past participation. In applicable categories, qualified peer judges from other genres will be permitted to judge, if necessary, to satisfy minimum panel requirements. If judging cannot be fulfilled by qualified member judges, the NATAS reserves the right to enlist qualified non-members but only when and where necessary to facilitate the fulfillment of panels.

MEMBERSHIP

All categories prioritize members-only judges but certain categories for the Daytime Emmy Awards are solely members-only judges. To check the status of your membership, become a member, or renew your membership:

JUDGING DEMOGRAPHICS

In order to enhance the Daytime Emmys' commitment to diversity in all parts of our contest, beginning this year, judges will be required to fill out a demographics survey at sign up. They will be requested to answer questions regarding their gender, race, and location. Response is voluntary. Declining to participate in no way affects your participation as a judge or panel placement in future competitions. Your responses will only be used for the Daytime Emmys to continue developing equitable and diverse judging pools.

INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT IN ANIMATION

The category of Individual Achievement in Animation is a Juried Award. Judging is conducted online using Peer Group members from the Television Academy and NATAS to determine the Emmy-worthiness of submissions in each of the animation craft areas of expertise. One, more than one, or none can win. Multiple recipients, however, are recognized independently. The award recipient(s) are notified of their accomplishment following the judging session.

2021 PLANS

NATAS has committed to all virtual ceremonies for 2021, regardless of potential improvements to the public health crisis.

Nominations are scheduled to be announced in June 2021. The list of nominees initially includes nominated programs, performers and crafts. After additional internal review, a list of nominations with **full credits** is posted shortly after on the NATAS website. It is incumbent on Entrants of Record to check the Producer's Proof and/or nominations press release to ensure all statue-eligible individuals are listed, names are spelling correctly, and are in the correct order.

CEREMONIES

There will be multiple virtual ceremonies in June/July 2021. Exact dates and division of categories will be announced at a later date.

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

In addition to all NATAS contest related follow up, Daytime nominees may be asked to submit additional materials for production, including but not limited to mp3s of nominated songs and artwork for Individual Achievement in Animation. The Entrant of Record is the de facto contact for nominees and it is incumbent upon them to communicate with nominees regarding materials and virtual ceremony plans.

- **NEW/IMPORTANT:** Limited Drama Series are eligible to enter designated craft categories that combine Drama and Daytime Fiction Program tracks.
- **NEW/IMPORTANT:** If your Series does not have the minimum of 5 episodes **and** THE MAJORITY of episodes are going to be aired/streamed in 2021 due to the pandemic, please enter next year. There is a one-year rule change allowing for 2020 content in this situation.

Executive Producer[s], Executive Producer/Host, Co- Executive Producer[s], Senior Supervising Producer[s], Supervising Producer[s], Coordinating Producer[s], Senior Producer[s], Producer[s], Culinary Producer[s], Segment Producer[s], Line Producer[s] Co-Producer[s] and Consulting Producer[s] credited on a minimum of 19% of total episodes first airing in the 2020 calendar year.

NOTES:

- **Informational or instructional** culinary programming designed for all age groups is welcome in the Daytime competition. **Competition-style** culinary programs featuring **children as contestants** are welcome in the Daytime competition. **Competition-style** culinary programs featuring **adults as contestants** should enter the Primetime competition.
- Informational or instructional programming with culinary segments (those which don't contain at least a 50% culinary emphasis) should enter into **Instructional or How-To Program (Category 12)**.

NOTES:

- Game Shows which air nationally between **2:00am and 8:00pm** compete in the Daytime Emmy Awards contest. Game shows initially transmitted at 8pm ET on a single feed network, e.g., via the internet or some cable platforms, that reach less than half of the country at 8pm ET and more than half the country prior to 8pm ET (7pm CT + 6pm MT + 5pm PT), qualify in the Daytime Emmy competition.
- NEW/IMPORTANT: Directors of a Game Show no longer have their own category. They are eligible in **Directing Team for a Multiple Camera Daytime Non-Fiction Program (Category 48)**.

- Adult Programming, Comedy-based and Reality Competition Shows that reflect Primetime content are not eligible in this contest, but may be eligible to enter the Primetime Emmy Awards.
- Programs providing a passive, linear viewing experience should consider entering Short Format or Short Format Children's categories.
- Talent - Performers, Anchors, Correspondents or Hosts and other Crafts-persons contributing to the programming may be eligible to be entered in applicable performer, host and craft categories.

Be sure that the placement does not obscure the performer. This will aid judges in identifying and focusing on the character being evaluated, especially if multiple characters are interacting.

- An individual may enter multiple submissions in this category but only if the achievements are for different programs.
- In the case of a single character being played by more than one performer (e.g. a speaking voice and a singing voice), prepare a single entry but be sure to add each performer to the entry form and make special note of this in the Information/Essay section on the online submission form.
- A performer may submit themselves if the program or network does not. In this instance, the performer should contact the show before submitting to obtain video and avoid entry duplication.

VIDEO SUBMISSION:

- Submit a **composite reel of all appearances from the Special or from any ONE episode of a Series up to 20 minutes total running time**. Scenes must be lifted as aired without any additional editing (no montages). It may contain a single voice/character performance or multiple voices/characters. - In the event that a Hybrid Live-Action and Animated series involved significant work of a Voice Director for animated characters, (according to the parameters above), upon notification to Daytime administration, they may enter this category.

VIDEO SUBMISSION:

- Songs are occasionally released commercially at the same time as they premier on a program or episode. If they are written expressly for first use on the episode they may be eligible if the release and air dates coincide. You must supply details to the Daytime Administration when entering to avoid unnecessary challenge and investigation.
- Performers and artists are not eligible unless they are credited as a Composer or Lyricist.

Guest Character: One episode only

Incidental Character: Wild Sounds/Under 5

NOTES:

CATEGORIES 100, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105 - OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT IN ANIMATION

TRACK: HYBRID DRAMA, FICTION, NON-FICTION, CHILDREN'S

(For a Single Episode of a Series or Special)

This category recognizes **individual achievement in six possible animation disciplines: Background Design, Character Animation and Character Design, Color, Production Design and Storyboard.** There can be one, more than one, or no recipients in each discipline. Team entries are not allowed. An individual may enter multiple achievements if the achievements are for different programs.

This category differs from other Daytime Emmy animation categories. Please read these rules closely and contact Administration if you have any questions.

NOTES:

- This is a Juried Award. A panel of judges composed of qualified animation professionals, determine the Emmy worthiness of submissions in each of the areas of expertise detailed below. Judging is scheduled for **March 2021**.
- There can be one, more than one, or no recipients. Multiple recipients, however, are recognized independently.
- Along with uploading a video and corresponding credits to the Yangaroo site, this category requires the preparation of and uploading artwork.
- **NEW/IMPORTANT:** All subcategories are now entered and adjudicated online. All artwork will be digitally submitted, at the time of entry, by uploading a single PDF file. Printed hardcopies of the entrant's artwork will no longer be accepted.
- Upload only the video and/or single PDF file requested for each sub-group. Do not upload a folder with files in it. Each entry must be individually uploaded. Most importantly - QC your work and file.
- Artwork must be originally created for the submitted episode, and no stock will be accepted unless it was created specifically for the submitted episode and first aired in the 2020 calendar year. Please see additional note under Background Design.
- Materials submitted should best represent the artist's creative process and finished artwork. Additional supporting artwork may be submitted to show the artist's thought process in achieving their final work.

NOTES: (CONTINUATION)

- If possible, digital artwork should include a signature of the artist and director or producer. The purpose of the signatures is to ensure that the artist, director and/or producer are aware that the entry is being made and that the correct entry materials are being submitted. If signatures are not able to be obtained (e.g. no longer employed, out of the country, etc.) the entry will still be accepted. If you are unable to obtain signatures, please include a brief written statement explaining why on the first page of your PDF. This can also be noted on the Submission Information field on the entry form.
- This category is for the individual artist who created the original artwork – supervisors and leads are only eligible if they themselves created the artwork submitted. Job titles may vary from studio to studio.
- No submission will be considered an entry unless it is complete. If the Administration does not receive any response to requests for additional information and/or materials, the submission may be considered ineligible.

For the individual artist responsible for drawing the background layouts, designing backgrounds or designing sets.

ELIGIBLE TITLES: (CONTINUATION)

Please note: You may submit stock images if they have been adapted, revised, or re-dressed in such a way as to render them unrecognizable as previously submitted work. Please also include image of previously submitted scene for comparison. The eligibility for entry will be reviewed in the vetting process on a case-by-case basis.

BACKGROUND LAYOUT ARTISTS

- **Upload a single PDF file** of layouts digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible), along with the corresponding storyboard pages (when they are used in the designing process) – PDF must include a minimum of five and must be in black and white or grayscale*.
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted artwork. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and a brief description of work.
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

BACKGROUND (KEY) DESIGNERS

- **Upload a single PDF file** of key drawings digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible) – PDF must include a minimum of five and must be in black and white or grayscale*.
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted artwork. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and a brief description of work.
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

SET DESIGNERS

- **Upload a single PDF file** of drawings, a minimum of five, directly related to the design, build, and modeling of the set, digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible). Drawings may include floor plans, orthographic views, details of set elements, etc. Within the PDF file, designers must submit multiple views and/or camera angles of the finished set design to illustrate the scope of the original designs and must be submitted in black and white or grayscale*.

For the individual artist responsible for bringing an animated character to life through movement and acting.

- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to their work only. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and the character's image and name(s).
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

CHARACTER LAYOUT ARTISTS

- **Upload a single PDF** file of a minimum of five scenes (scenes do not need to be sequential), digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible).
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted artwork. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and a brief description of work, you may also include corresponding animatic.
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

Character Designer

For the individual artist responsible for designing and drawing original production characters.

Artwork should include the entrant's rough sketches and final color production designs and must include the names of the characters. Re-dressing an existing character does not constitute an original design.
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted artwork. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and a brief description of work.
- **Upload – Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

CATEGORY 103

COLOR

ELIGIBLE TITLE:

Color Stylist, Color Key, Color Key Stylist, Color Key Design, Color Designer, Colorist, Background Keys, Background Stylist, Background Artist, Background Color Stylist, Background Color, Background Painter, Digital Background Painter

For the individual artist responsible for the color of characters, props, effects and backgrounds for the submitted single episode of a series or a special.

- **Upload a single PDF file** of their artwork from one episode of the series or special, digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible).
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted artwork. Slate video with title of show, episode title, entrant's name and a brief description of work.
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

CATEGORY 104

CHARACTER DESIGN

ELIGIBLE TITLE:

Production Designer, Art Director

For the individual artist responsible for the overall “look” or “style” of a show - all inclusive.

- **Upload a single PDF file** of their artwork which can include background designs, character designs, sketches, paintings or digital print outs, digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible). Include, on the first page of your PDF, a concise, accurate statement of the entrant’s contribution (100 words or less) which validates a substantial, creative, hands-on contribution to the final project. **This should not be a logline or synopsis of the program. It needs to be an actual description of the entrant’s work on this specific episode.**
- **Upload** a finished video of the entire episode or special as aired. Slate video with title of show, episode title and entrant’s name.
- **Upload** a Word doc or PDF of the beginning and end credits.

Entrants in this sub-category may not submit additional entries (for the same program) for Character Design, Color or Background Design.

Please note: Artwork that is prominently displayed in the submission that is not personally created by the entrant must be credited to clearly identify the artist(s) responsible for the artwork, **in the negative space each page of the PDF.**

CATEGORY 105

STORYBOARD

ELIGIBLE TITLE:

Storyboard Artist

For the individual artist responsible for drawing the storyboard blueprint from an outline or a script.

- **Upload a single-panel PDF file** of their original storyboard with corresponding dialogue, action notes and screen direction notes digitally signed by the artist and director or producer (if possible)
- **Upload a finished video** of the episode or special, as aired, edited to show corresponding scenes of submitted storyboard. Slate video with title of show, episode title and entrant's name.
- **Upload a Word doc or PDF** of the beginning and end credits.

For all Entrants in all categories: In the **Information/Essay** field, you will be asked to submit a summary of up to 200 words that WILL be included on the judges' ballots as an accompaniment to the viewing material. The Essay is NOT required but is highly recommended.

DOS:

- Write about your entertainment, motivational, instructional, informational or educational goals, and research
- Write about production and creative techniques used
- Write about challenges that were met
- Write about the impact of your program after it aired
- Proofread and spell check
- **Drama Series** and **Limited Drama Series** Entrants:
 - Summarize events and storylines leading up to your episode
 - Acknowledge any materials from prior to the calendar year
 - Limit of 200 words total, NOT 200 words per episode submitted
- **Craft** Entrants:
 - Give a technical description of your efforts
- **Daytime Non-Fiction Series** and **Daytime Non-Fiction Special Writing** Entrants:
 - Highlight what aspects were pre-written/scripted versus improvised
- **Promo** essays should include an explanation outlining the promo's specific goals. This essay should also address the degree to which the promo "sells" the episode without misrepresenting the facts of the story underlying it.
- The **Interactive** category essay should include a description of the overall goals and strategy, and the features, functionality and user experience. If the content is an enhancement or derivative of a television program, please provide a brief background of the source material for the interactive content.

DONT'S:

- Go over the 200 word limit
- Have typos and grammatical errors
- Submit promotional material

Entrants must fill in the Time Into Video section in the Entry. This designates the start time of the 30 seconds you wish to be used as your clip should the Entry receive a nomination and be featured in a ceremony clip production package. The identified clip must be free and clear of any and all encumbrances which could limit the ability of NATAS to include the clip in the program and its distribution, publicity, and promotion, including without limitation digital program archives, in perpetuity. Entrants must affirm that all necessary rights and clearances have been obtained and are thereby licensed to NATAS for these purposes, and that the entrant is authorized to convey such rights.

DOS:

- Using the first frame of video in your submission as your “zero” point, identify the point in terms of minutes and seconds from that “zero” point where the 30 second section begins
- Guarantee the clip is licensed and cleared by appropriate parties for usage in the program, distribution, publicity, promotion and archives in perpetuity

DONT’S:

- Identify a portion of the clip not licensed and cleared by appropriate parties for usage in the program, distribution, publicity, promotion, and archives in perpetuity
- Use a time into video indicating where the content is in the complete episode, not the submission video (if a complete episode was not submitted)

All entries **require** filling out the Episode References field. This field lets Administration know that all episodes featured in your submission aired within the eligibility window (January 1-December 31, 2020). The Episode References field comprises of UP TO THREE elements, depending on category:

1 – Episode Name or Number – what is either the name of number of the episode(s) featured in the submission

2 – Airdate – what is the original airdate for the episode(s) featured in your submission

3 – Time Code – what is the time code of when this episode is featured in the reel

For full episode or full Special entries:

- **DO** fill in only one Reference with the name/number and the airdate

For clip reel entries:

- **DO** fill in MULTIPLE References, one for each episode featured in the reel
- **DO** mark the time code where the new episode begins WITHIN YOUR REEL (not within the source material!)
