LEADING LADY LEGEND

A number of years ago, when Susan Lucci was in Los Angeles filming a starring role in a primetime television movie, this writer was assigned to do a cover story on her for a weekly magazine. When I arrived at the set in mid-afternoon, Lucci was changing into her dress for the photo shoot, which was about to occur during a break in filming. The photographer and show publicist, both industry veterans, were beside themselves in disbelief and excitement that she was doing the shoot then.

"You don't understand," the photographer said when I asked why this was such a big deal. "I've worked with hundreds of stars on these covers. Susan Lucci is the only one who hasn't kept me waiting till the end of the filming day to do the shoot."

When told recently of this distinction, Lucci is surprised. While she doesn't remember the exact details of the day, "I didn't think it was nice to keep people waiting, certainly, if you didn't have to," she says. "And I guess I was used to just 'Keep on going, Keep on doing,' from the soap schedule, because that was a schedule — we used to call it, 'Old Man River,' you know?"

"The soap," of course, is All My Children, the ABC daytime drama on which Lucci starred as Erica Kane, keeping on going and doing from 1970 to 2011 and finally winning the Daytime Emmy® as Outstanding Lead Actress in a Drama Series in 1999, after a famous losing streak of 18 previous nominations.

The actress took Erica from a vixenish 15-year-old, already embroiled in romantic entanglements, to an indomitable, oft-married diva-mother-grandmother whose scheming and self-centeredness were legion, yet still imbued with heart, propelled by Erica's lifelong need for love and validation after her father abandoned her as a child.

One of soapdom's most popular characters, Erica overcame such challenges as a teenage rape, painkiller addiction, even a prison stint. Along the way, she forged careers as a model, book author and cosmetics company owner, among others. When last seen on AMC she was preparing to leave her fictional hometown of Pine Valley, near Philadelphia, to work on the movie version of her memoir in Los Angeles, having been told by ex-husband-turned-fiancé Jackson Montgomery that he would no longer give up his dreams for hers.

Twelve years after the show ended its broadcast run, what has stayed with Lucci about her four decade-plus AMC experience?

"The joy of playing that part and having such good material, and playing the scenes with such incredible actors," she says immediately. "But also, the popularity of the character, because the audience just embraced her, which was always a surprise to me, because she was not the girl next door! She was the bad girl in town, but she was so much fun to play. And the audience really embraced her, and me, and I got to do a lot of other really wonderful things."

Those "wonderful things" include primetime roles in telefilms and series such as *Devious Maids* and *Hot in Cleveland*; concert appearances with composer Marvin Hamlisch, who had asked to meet her when she attended a show of his and, well before winning her Emmy®, encouraged her not to give up hope; a cabaret act with Regis Philbin and a cherished dream come true, a starring role on Broadway, in the musical Annie Get Your Gun in late 1999-early 2000.

The Broadway offer came after Lucci's Daytime Emmy® win, for which she received a prolonged standing ovation from those in the room and likely, fans in their own rooms across the nation.

"It was such a range of emotions, all fantastic," she recalls. "The nominations were a big honor. But the actual winning was much better. After the ninth time I didn't win, I would go numb whenever they would announce the name. So when that night came, Rosie O'Donnell reached over and took my evening bag, and my husband picked me up by my elbow. And I actually whispered in his ear, 'Are you sure?' And he assured me that, 'Yes. It really did happen."

The golden statuette now sits "center stage, on my mantel in our living room." At first, out of modesty, she kept it on her bedroom dresser, but after seeing EGOT winner Hamlisch's Emmy®, Grammy®, Oscar® and Tony® Awards on his mantel, "It was so beautiful for me to see," she says. "I didn't think it was showy of him. And that gave me a different perspective on it. I thought, I should do that. And anyway, I only have the one!"

Sadly, Lucci's famously supportive husband of almost 53 years, Austrian chef-turned-writer-producer Helmut Huber, died of a stroke in March 2022. They married in 1969, the same year she won the role of Erica, and became the parents of daughter Liza and son Andreas.

"There are not enough words," she says simply, when asked to comment about him. "I was so lucky to have him in my life. So lucky." Lucci has had her own health scares, undergoing heart surgeries


in 2018 and 2022 because of artery blockage. She is an ambassador for the American Heart Association's "Go Red for Women" campaign, advocating for women's cardiovascular health awareness.

"I began getting the message out to women: Put yourself on your to-do list. You need to, because we most often are not," she says. "We take care of our children, our homes, our husbands, we're everybody's advocate but our own. And listen to your body. If your body is not behaving in a way that is normal for you, don't hesitate to call the doctor."

Turning to more celebratory topics, the actress is thrilled to be

honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award at the Daytime Emmys®, recognizing the indelible mark she has made in daytime drama. "I'm so happy to be there, and very excited," she says.

Reflecting on her career — her role as Erica, the adoration of fans, the many opportunities that have come her way — Lucci adds, "I'm so grateful. And I feel so lucky. I dreamed of being an actress since I was a little girl, but to get to grow up and do it, and then have people respond to you, it's really something. It's really amazing."

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LIFETIME **ACHIEVEMENT HONOREE**

STORYTELLER

As Maury Povich prepares to receive the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences' Lifetime Achievement Award, he's willing to share the credo that's powered his remarkable six-decade long career in broadcasting, a bit of wisdom passed down from his father, the renowned sports journalist Shirley Povich.

"He just drilled this into my head: we are all storytellers," Povich, 84, explains. "We all see things through our own eyes and our own experiences. No matter where you are and what you're doing, you're telling a story. That's been my mantra all of my life. It doesn't matter in which arena I ever was — whether it was as a news reporter, whether it was a news anchor, whether it was a daytime host, whether it was doing A Current Affair. Wherever I was, the only thing I thought about in every instance was to tell a story."

Povich hoped to follow in his journalist father's footsteps, but by the time he graduated college the no-nepotism policy at his father's employer The Washington Post and the reluctance of competing newspapers to hire the son of a rival's star columnist closed the print door in the D.C. area. He fancied broadcasting, but nascent TV stations were only hiring people with experience in radio, so he finally stuck a toe in the door for an all-news station as a publicity writer in 1962.

"I just hung around the newsroom, so often that the news director got tired of me hanging around and hired me," he recalls. "I would be

covering a fatal automobile accident one hour, and I might be on Capitol Hill covering something in the Senate or the House the next hour. I might be doing a bank robbery, and then a few hours later I might be at the White House...I covered the return of Jackie Kennedy from Dallas in 1963 with that bloodied pink suit of hers, coming off Air Force One at Andrews Air Force Base. I covered the Martin Luther King speech at the Memorial in 1963."

In 1966 he at last transitioned into television at WTTG; a year later he was recruited into a daring experiment: co-hosting *Panorama*, the first local D.C. mid-day broadcast to air following NBC's The Today Show, which "became must-see TV for the entire federal government," Povich recalls. Achieving national recognition, he ventured onto a broader stage, anchoring, reporting and hosting at various stations around the country for several years before ultimately returning to Panorama in 1983, where he also enjoyed a concurrent, Emmy®-winning news anchor stint.

After the Australian media mogul Rupert Murdoch acquired WTTG in 1986, the anchor was summoned to a meeting. "He says, 'I have a program that I want you to host," Povich explains, noting that Murdoch's proposal would relocate him to New York, where his former anchor partner and then-new wife Connie Chung was based — a welcome opportunity, as the couple had been commuting for two years to be together. Murdoch's proposal for the tabloid-minded syndicated newsmagazine A Current Affair instantly piqued Povich's curiosity.

"I was always interested in the next thing," he says. "I had this kind of a rebel reputation, and I was thrown in with these absolutely crazily creative Australians, and it worked — it just meshed. They respected me and I respected them." The show was so immediately, enormously popular that within six months it was airing in 200 markets, elevated from an 11:30 p.m. berth to a prime 7:30 p.m. timeslot. It delivered even higher ratings than stalwarts like Entertainment Tonight and Wheel of Fortune, powered greatly by the delighted gleam in the otherwise polished host's eye when delving deep into scandalous fodder. "There were no barriers for us. We might do some crazy story that nobody else did," says Povich.

The impact of A Current Affair on the landscape of broadcast journalism was both profound and enduring. "There are a lot of critics who say that we changed television news," he says. "It seeped into every single news broadcast there was...We were doing Jim and Tammy Faye Baker and his scandal because he was sleeping with his secretary, and you would've thought that was the most salacious story in the world. Then all of a sudden, Ted Koppel on Nightline was doing 30 straight nights on the same story."

Conversely, Povich was soon reporting on events with international repercussions. "My biggest memory was we went to the Berlin Wall, and I'm anchoring next to Tom Brokaw and Dan Rather, and they're looking at me — I knew them both — and they say, 'What the hell are you doing here?' I said, 'Well, I can guarantee you we aren't doing the same story!" (Indeed, his show explored Berlin's notorious red-light district, a taboo topic no network would have touched at the time.)

Despite the show's phenomenal success, Povich remained everhungry for new experiences, and in 1991 — the peak of the increasingly crowded, ubiquitous landscape of syndicated daytime talk shows battling for viewers' loyalties — he launched The Maury Povich Show. "I thought it was going to be some kind of a version of Phil Donahue," he chuckles of the initial seven-year run, which ultimately focused on tame topics like guests revealing secret crushes. But when the show was rebranded as Maury, the producers proposed a new, recurring theme: revealing guests' questioned or contested paternity test results in front of his live studio audience.

Povich was intrigued by the fast-tracked soap-opera appeal, but never expected the sensation that resulted. A key factor, he believes, was his insistence on not knowing the results of the tests in advance of the

reveals. "That's how the whole signature — 'You are the father,' 'You are not the father' — came about, because I didn't know any more than anyone else," he reveals. "I was as shocked or surprised as the guests and the audience were. I think that kind of reality served the show so well."

The new formula catapulted the show — and the host — into the zeitgeist iconography. "The reaction that people had, [and] the way it cut across so many age groups and socioeconomic groups — it was amazing!" he says. Povich's catchphrase became a staple of stand-up comics and late-night hosts' routines; college students flooded into the studio audience, while high school kids faked illness to stay home and watch; Povich found himself revered by his grandchildren's contemporaries and hailed on the street by blue-collar workers calling out "Hey Maury — I'm not the father!" His cultural cachet spiked: The New York Times crossword puzzle referenced him; he guest-starred on top sitcoms like How I Met Your Mother and 30 Rock. Tina Fey says it was the funniest episode she could ever remember on the show," he says proudly.

"Maury has a clever, wry, sardonic, acerbic sense of humor with a devilish twinkle and smile, never offensive. Maury takes his work

seriously but never himself," says Chung of her husband. His cerebral side is equally impressive, she says, if seen mostly at home. "Maury is a voracious reader — history, biographies, novels, politics, you name it — he's read it. He is a political buff and a history buff...I always say to Maury, 'Why don't you do an intellectual interview program? You are so smart, knowledgeable and such a superb interviewer?' He replies, 'As long as you know that, I'm fine."

When Povich finally chose to retire in 2022, the decision came with little handwringing. "If I count when I've been around, since I was 16 years old, this is 67 years," he explains. "My father worked for 75 years. I know I'll never catch him, so that's enough."


And the storytelling lessons of his father continued to inform his approach throughout every iteration of his career, covering everything from the serious to the sensational. "Everybody's looking for viewers," he says. "And how do you get viewers? Well, guess what: you do it the same way. You do all the Shakespearean themes. That's the classic thing. Whether it's betrayal or lust or greed or all these various themes that Shakespeare had, that's going to get you the viewers."







Part of the inaugural television class at the University of Wisconsin, Schwartz's first on-air gig was July 3, 1953 in Madison, Wisconsin at WKOW. From the booth, to the studio to the field,

Schwartz has spent time in nearly every seat in the biz.

In the mid 50s he served in the Armed Forces Far East Headquarters producing variety shows at officers clubs in Tokyo, Japan. Schwartz was stationed at Camp Zama and assigned as a liaison to introduce Far East talent to Ed Sullivan.

In 1968, Schwartz was transplanted to the west coast to work on The John Gary Show and later shows from Far Out Space Nuts to Welcome Back Kotter. The path eventually led to a four-decade stint with Dick Clark Productions, overseeing more than 200 hours of television production, including the TV movie The Man in the Santa Claus Suit starring Fred Astaire. With a specialty of awards programming, Schwartz oversaw The American Music Awards, the Academy of Country Music Awards, The Prime Time Emmy® Awards, The Daytime Emmy® Awards, The Jim Thorpe Pro Sports Awards, The Family Television Awards, MTV Awards and The Golden Globes (just to name a few).
