As the busy "news decade" that was the summer of 2024 draws to a close, we are delighted to welcome you back to the Palladium Times Square for the 45th Annual News & Documentary Emmy® Awards. Thank you for joining us.

We gather here once again to honor excellence in truth-seeking journalism at a time when the craft continues to come under assault. While we recently celebrated, with great relief, the safe return of Wall Street Journal reporter Evan Gershkovich and Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty's Alsu Kurmasheva from unjust imprisonment in Russia, more than 300 other

journalists remain imprisoned around the world according to the most recent census by the Committee to Protect Journalists. At least three dozen journalists have been killed this year.

Those who shine a light on inconvenient truths, give voice to the voiceless, or simply report documented facts are far too often punished through efforts to demonize and delegitimize such essential work. On these two nights, we do the vital opposite. AUTHENTIC

One might presume that — after a storied, still-thriving fiveplus-decade career in broadcast journalism and on the threshold of receiving a Lifetime Achievement distinction at the 45th Annual News & Documentary Emmy Awards — Jane Pauley's living her professional dream.

But discard visions of a young Jane practicing on-air delivery in her girlhood bedroom in Indiana, fantasizing about the interviews and acclaim ahead. While her career was by no means accidental, it's rooted in recognizing tremendous opportunity over realizing long-nurtured aspiration. "A reporter asked me if broadcasting had been my dream," says Pauley, "and I replied that it had just been my best idea."

A speech and debate champion in high school and political science major in college, Pauley was working her first post-graduation job on a political campaign when a reporter tipped her to an open on-air position at a local TV station — "specifically, and this was a quote, for a 'female-type person," she laughs. "On that basis, I certainly qualified."

Pauley felt she might also be the right fit due to her uniquely specific skillset: "Extemporaneous speaking was my thing," she recalls. "I cannot describe a better preparation for doing my seven-minute interviews on the Today show than being a 16-year-old, giving a seven-minute speech on the balance of trade, or something about which I would have known seven minutes worth, maybe, to fake it. But I was fluent in current events and I was very engaged in the news."

The dawn of the 1970s was also a cultural moment when workplaces increasingly opened up to professional women — including TV news desks. "Women were present on the air — not in great numbers — and I was watching a reporter and I remember thinking 'I could do that.' Parenthetically, I might have thought 'I could do that better."

Her instincts were on point: though her audition marked the first time she'd ever written a news story or read from a teleprompter, she beat out 200 applicants for the job. "I was the first person [the news director] had ever interviewed, much less hired without journalism experience or a degree in journalism, but he hired me," she says. "And I then had this career that I like to describe as a mystery wrapped in a magic carpet."

Indeed, Pauley experienced a rather supersonic rise landing increasingly higher-profile anchor chairs, culminating in 1976 when she was named as Barbara Walters' successor on NBC's morning program Today at just 25 years old — Pauley herself was so stupefied that her first words on the air after introducing herself were 'Maybe you're wondering how I got here. Maybe I am too."

"It was so true," she says nearly 50 years later. "Nobody else was wondering, but that's what I felt, and I went on feeling that way for a really long time." She describes experiencing a sense of what would later be coined imposter syndrome. "Because you know you're supposed to come to the job in the way Barbara and Connie Chung, Judy Woodruff and Leslie Stahl did...The hard way. And I didn't." Nevertheless, Pauley's combination of on-air poise and young working woman persona struck a chord with viewers — in that arcane way television reaches through the screen to create intimate bonds of fondness and loyalty throughout her 13-year run.

"I have since become aware — I wasn't at the time — of how many young women were watching and the impact of the presence of someone who looked like them," she reflects. "So many of my generation were just new women in the workforce, and I was, I suppose, a role model." Her contemporaries, she suggests, often "felt alone in your stress, guilt, weariness, and if you didn't know a lot of other people going through it, there was Jane — particularly after I had children. Even if I didn't look so great one morning, it was, 'Well, Jane must have been up with the kids."

During Pauley's tenure, *Today* — along with its ratings rival, ABC's Good Morning America — also evolved to define the morning news programming format for decades to follow, enduring today — particularly

in which the broadcasters themselves become endearing personalities. At the time, traditionally perceived feminine roles and attributes often led the discourse around Pauley.

"I never heard anybody comment about Tom Brokaw's hair before; nobody remarked on the fact that he was the father of three," she says. "But I was a different story. And I'm not speaking resentfully: it's just that was a fact. It was a new and, I think, impactful role that news women all over the country were playing."

Such cultural factors also played into Pauley's departure from *Today*, As the ratings war with GMA intensified in 1989, decade-younger newswoman Deborah Norville's increasing duties and airtime sparked a perception that at 39 Pauley was slowly being elbowed out; a frenzied All About Eve-style media narrative bubbled up, with critic Tom Shales suggested Pauley was TV's first Baby Boomer being put out to pasture.

"Deborah would later be cast unfairly as the villain in the set piece of the reporting of the apparent transition at Today, and I was cast as the heroine," says Pauley. "But the reality was I was not being shown the door." Pauley was prepared to pass the baton, but the network was enjoying the ratings bump and press bonanza that ensued. "NBC wanted to have it both ways, and we had these discussions privately; they were prolonged, protracted and in secret," she says. Ending the faux scandal, her negotiated departure was ascribed to a desire to spend more time with her husband, "Doonesbury" cartoonist Garry Trudeau, and their young family. "The end result? I did not leave NBC to go home to my children, but I did leave the Today show."

She was elevated by NBC into primetime, successfully launching Dateline NBC as co-host — the network's first ratings hit newsmagazine after many failed attempts — and joining rarefied ranks as a fill-in for her former Today colleague Tom Brokaw at the NBC Nightly News anchor desk. "Tom once sent me a message about how comfortable he felt being abroad and knowing I was minding the desk, which was such a great compliment," she recalls.

Pauley exited Dateline in 2003 for an adventurous leap into the daytime talk with The Jane Pauley Show, which she calls "the hardest thing I ever did — it was hair-on-fire, all the time." Despite being the season's top-rated new entry, it couldn't contend with juggernaut Oprah Winfrey but remains a badge of honor. "Nothing makes me prouder than having survived that year and having said yes to it," she says. "I defined success as having the courage to try, and on that basis alone the show was a big success...A little failure on your resume is healthy."

At that point, she'd become accustomed to exciting, unexpected opportunities swiftly presenting themselves. "I really, really expected that the phone would ring. It did not," she chuckles. "And for a very long time I contemplated what I would do in my opportunity now to reinvent myself." She recognized that it was time to create openings for herself, including returning to Today with the recurring segment Your Life Calling, which she developed herself with sponsor AARP. "So Entrepreneurial Jane was born! It was the first time I made the opportunity, I didn't say yes to it."

Similarly, a last-minute booking as a guest on CBS Sunday Morning morphed into a contributing role and, ultimately, assuming the hosting reins from retiring Charles Osgood — a position she retains today; still viable in a leading role at an anchor desk at 73, and as visible a role model as ever.

Pauley belatedly discovered years of network research indicating the attribute viewers most commonly associated with her was authentic. "I eventually learned that I had one persona and I couldn't change it to fit something more successful, a new trend, a tough-talking, hard-bitten whatever it was — I couldn't fake it," she notes. "Authentic is not difficult to live up to if you if you are simply being real. It takes one variable off the table. I could still be myself. Authenticity won't win you a DuPont, but it might have helped explain the longevity part of my career."



CHARTING HIS OWN COURSE

Alex Gibney, this year's recipient of the Emmy Awards' Lifetime Achievement Award in Documentary Filmmaking, is humbled by the recognition but likens the honor less as a valedictory than to being in a rowboat: "An opportunity to look back at the same time as you're moving forward."

Though the Oscar/Emmy/Grammy winner didn't direct his first documentary until he was almost fifty, since then he's directed and/or produced a slate of highly acclaimed features and limited series delving into complex and controversial subjects such as white-collar crime (Enron: The Smartest Guys in the Room), child sex abuse (Mea Maxima Culpa: Silence in the House of God), the inner workings of the Church of Scientology in (Going Clear: Scientology and the Prison of Belief), and the U.S. government's torture program (the Oscar-winning Taxi to the Dark Side). He has also provided meticulously researched and highly entertaining analyses of such influential and divisive personalities as Steve Jobs, Elizabeth Holmes and Julian Assange.


Like feature films, says Gibney, the best documentaries "tell compelling stories, and humans have a deep affinity for stories. Psychologists say we absorb information better through stories."


If there's an overarching theme in his work it is power and the abuse of power. His targets have been institutions like the Catholic Church, the U.S. or foreign governments, and even enterprising individuals blinded by ambition. "Take Julian Assange and Wikileaks. He challenged the abuse of power and then abused the power he'd acquired. Elizabeth Holmes came out of Silicon Valley, whose motto is 'move fast and break things.' While it's good to shake things up sometimes, what kind of value is there in breaking someone's health? Or Jeffrey Skilling at Enron, who thought he had a noble cause and that entitled him to be corrupt."

The native New Yorker's early heroes were his father, journalist Frank Gibney, and his stepfather, the activist Reverend William Sloane Coffin. After graduating from Yale, Gibney attended UCLA Film School where he caught "the film bug," he says. "The 70s were the great era for independent filmmaking, a period in which you could express yourself even if you weren't part of the Hollywood machine — through feature films like Easy Rider or documentaries like Gimme Shelter.

Gibney gravitated to documentaries because he became frustrated with the process of making features where "you spend a great deal of time in development hell. And then you have to wait for the script to be approved. And then for the financing to come together. And then for the right casting. With documentaries, if you can figure out how to raise the money, the financiers will let you go off and figure out how to make the film without interference."

Ah, funding, now there's the rub. Fortunately, Gibney began making films at a moment when there was a new appreciation for auteur documentaries thanks to such popular works as Errol Morris's The Thin Blue Line, Steve James's Hoop Dreams and Werner Herzog's Grizzly Man. These films demonstrated that "there were no rules,"

he says. "You could tell stories with unconventional structures and free-flowing formats. The only limit was the filmmakers' imagination."

Another contributing factor was the rise of reality TV — "nonfiction works that were as exciting as scripted dramas and starred real people."

Among Gibney's inspirations were Morris, Marcel Ophuls (The Sorrow and the Pity), Herzog, Wim Wenders, Michael Apted, and Agnes Varda. It is on their shoulders that he proudly stands. Like these icons, Gibney tackles topics often ignored by traditional media. Through his Jigsaw Productions, based in downtown Manhattan, Gibney has produced and/or directed an enviable slate of documentary features and limited series, starting first in theaters and then branching out to cable TV and streaming.

"There's never been anyone like Alex in the documentary field," says Jeffrey Wright, the writer, producer, and performer with whom Gibney worked on the limited series Going Clear, among others. "He'll have as many as five movies underway at any given time either as producer or director. He has probably a hundred and forty employees or more all people he has brought into the film business and mentored. The documentary business is alive and healthy largely because he champions new talent."

Gibney acknowledges that the quality and quantity of his output would be impossible without the executive team at Jigsaw, his researchers and crews, and especially his cinematographers and editors. "They are my muses and my co-creators," he asserts.

Gibney has also indulged his sideline passion, music. "I'm not a musician but I'm fascinated by how people make music," he says. He alternates his socio/political documentaries with music-themed works, a decision not unlike that of his writer friend David Halberstram. "David usually followed his political books with books on sports because he said, two people can have different politics, but at a Red Sox game, you're all cheering for the same team. Like sports, music connects us all."

Gibney's output about musicians and musical styles includes the

TV mini-series The Blues, as well as studies of such transformational figures as Frank Sinatra, James Brown, and Fela Kuti. His most recent effort is a four-hour exploration of Paul Simon's creative process. Notes Simon, "It was an honor and a pleasure to work with Alex. He's a master storyteller and he reconstructed my story in a way that allowed me to recognize myself and feel at ease with his vision of the truth."

While Gibney doesn't believe that his documentaries have altered the political or social landscape, he says that some have had an unexpected impact: His exposé on Enron didn't stop economic corruption but it drove more attention to white-collar crime. His Assange documentary was, in part, responsible for the commutation of Chelsea Manning's prison sentence for leaking damaging government documents. After Going Clear, several Scientologists left the church and came forward to discuss their experiences. Even a smaller film like No Stone Unturned about an unsolved murder in Ireland helped reveal the killer and a cover-up by the authorities.

"All you can hope for is that your work can maybe start a conversation and help people see the world a little differently," says Gibney.



Kamau Bell: Tales of a 6' 4", African American, Heterosexual, Cisgender, Left-Leaning,

Asthmatic, Black and Proud Blerd, Mama's Boy, Dad, and Stand-Up Comedian. His comedy special, Private School Negro, is available on Netflix. Kamau is on the board of directors for DonorsChoose, a nonprofit that helps teachers raise money for class projects, and Live Free, a nonprofit dedicated to ending gun violence, mass incarceration, and mass criminalization. Kamau is also the ACLU's Celebrity Ambassador for Racial Justice. In 2023, Kamau and his wife Melissa Hudson Bell co-founded Who Knows Best Productions, a media production company in Oakland, CA. RODNEY BATTEN

Rodney Batten's 50-year journey at NBC is a testament to his passion and dedication. From his start as a page in Washington, DC, to becoming the Senior White House Photographer in 2007, Rodney has captured some of the most pivotal moments in history, including the Oklahoma City bombing and

JFK Jr.'s plane crash. He's traveled the campaign trail with figures like Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama. Celebrated for his craft, Rodney has earned prestigious Lifetime Achievement Awards from both the White House News Photographers Association and the White House Correspondents Association. Even at age 70, his energy and commitment to the news never wavers.



RITA BRAVER

Since 1997, Rita Braver has been Sunday Morning's "go-to" correspondent, recognized for her zeal and reliability. A trailblazer in female broadcast journalism since the Nixon administration, she's one of the few journalists from 1972 still delivering top-tier reports. Colleagues affirm she can cover any story —

from arts and culture to politics and foreign affairs — and her storytelling is consistently lauded as thoughtful, incisive, and compelling.



MARÍA ANTONIETA COLLINS

María Antonieta Collins' distinguished career spans the three leading Spanish-language networks: Televisa, Telemundo, and Univisión, where she is currently a Senior Special Correspondent. Her work not only serves as a vital source of information but also plays a crucial role in advocating for the rights of the

MARVIN KALB

Marvin Kalb spent 30-plus years with CBS News and NBC News as the last recruit of Edward R. Murrow and a member of the "Murrow Boys." making complex international affairs accessible to a broad audience. He is a founding director of Harvard's Shorenstein Center. Until last year, he hosted *The Kalb Report*, the longest running monthly discussion group at the National Press Club in Washington.

Catherine "Cat" McKenzie is a trailblazer with more than 25 years of experience shaping news coverage, currently serving as Executive Producer for *GMA3*, *ABC News Live* and special programs. Cat made history as the first Black and Afro-Latina woman to executive produce a primetime news special at ABC News,

leading to the Emmy-award-winning series *Soul Of A Nation*, which brought real conversations on race, identity, and culture into our homes during primetime.



JAVIER MORGADO

Javier "Javi" Morgado is a seasoned television news executive with more than 25 years of experience, known for his influential role in shaping CNN's editorial direction as the Executive Producer of *At This Hour* with Kate Bolduan and previously *New Day*. A strong advocate for diversity and inclusion, Javi has

spearheaded initiatives to diversify newsrooms at CNN, ensuring broader representation in media. He is actively involved with the National Association of Hispanic Journalists and NLGJA: The Association of LGBTQ+ Journalists.



EDUARDO SUÁREZ

Eduardo Suárez has spent more than 40 years shaping Latino media, holding key roles at Univision, Telemundo, and Fox, where he developed culturally impactful content that resonated with diverse audiences. His career took off when scenes from a movie he shot from atop a construction crane led him to be named director for a prime-time broadcast about the square-rigged ship "Danmark," figuring he wouldn't be afraid to climb the rigging to get the important shots. Known for seamlessly blending anthropology and journalism, Tom's work powerfully captures the extraordinary in the everyday.

RANEY ARONSON-RATH

Raney Aronson-Rath has carved out a remarkable career as the executive producer of Frontline, PBS's flagship investigative journalism series. Under her leadership, Frontline has expanded its digital presence, reaching new, younger audiences through platforms like YouTube, where documentaries have garnered

millions of views. Raney is dedicated to transparency in journalism, exemplified by the Frontline Transparency Project, which allows the public to access unedited interviews and source material from their documentaries. Her work has also focused on holding corporations and governments accountable, tackling complex issues like disinformation, conspiracy theories, and the influence of big tech on democracy.



RIC ESTHER BIENSTOCK

Ric Esther Bienstock is a Canadian-based filmmaker whose documentaries champion civil society, social justice, and human rights, shedding light on some of the world's darkest corners. From sex trafficking and the human organ trade to corruption in boxing, and the horrors of the Holocaust, her films blend

challenging social content with accessible filmmaking. Often placing herself in high-risk environments, Ric uses media to drive change and educate global audiences. In 2019, she was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada for her dedication to raising awareness through film, and her recent work, Enslaved, featuring Samuel L. Jackson is a valuable tool used by the United Nations.



ABBY GINZBERG

Abby Ginzberg is a veteran filmmaker with more than 35 years of experience, dedicated to creating documentaries. Some of her most impactful works include Barbara Lee: Speaking Truth to Power, And Then They Came for Us, and Judging Juries. These films challenge audiences to think critically and inspire meaningful

change. Beyond her work behind the camera, Abby plays a crucial role in mentoring the next generation of filmmakers through the Berkeley Film Foundation. Under her leadership, the Foundation has provided nearly three million dollars in grants, supporting 300-plus films. Abby continues to foster a vibrant community of filmmakers with her work.



METTE HOFFMAN MEYER

Mette Hoffman Meyer is a Danish executive producer and founder of THE WHY Foundation. Over her thirty-year career, she has played a pivotal role in the international documentary industry, leading divisions at TV-2 Denmark and DR, the Danish public-service radio and television broadcasting company,

where she financed influential films like Taxi to the Dark Side and The Red Chapel, Through THE WHY Foundation, Mette has launched global campaigns like Why Democracy? and Why Poverty?, reaching millions and sparking critical conversations.



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JOHN D'INCECCO

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
